

IT'S GOOD TO TALK WITH YOU, MOTHER

Alice Van der Wielen-Honinckx, the 6th Belgian artist to benefit from our partnership with the Flemish government, has conducted research at LE 18 in which embroidery and meditation were used as a way to enter in conversation about our interconnectedness through lines of transmission. Her project evolved to become a collaborative crafting and discussions with the Gifted Mothers of Dar Bellarj and with a larger group of collaborators for translation and mediation.

Alice Van der Wielen-Honinckx, the 6th Belgian artist to benefit from our partnership with the Flemish government, conducted research at LE 18 using embroidery and meditation as a way to initiate conversations about our interconnectedness through lines of transmission. Her project evolved into collaborative crafting and discussions with the Gifted Mothers of Dar Bellarj, as well as involving a larger group of collaborators for translation and mediation. The work presented here is an ongoing outcome of the conversation, in which Alice invites visitors to enter her creative space and experience the process through audio and images that embrace multiple languages and interpretations.

AKAL

In an age where information travels instantly anywhere, and some bodies move more easily than others, how do we relate to places? How are we embedded? Or, how embedded are we? And how does this degree of embeddedness impact our relationship to the fibres coming from that land?

In this room, you find wool from Malika Eloualy's aunt in the Atlas valley Ait Bouguemez. The wool grew on the family's sheep, was shaved (talousi), washed (tarda), combed (amchad), and spun (oulman), by Touda, her mother, then collected by the artists in Malika's motherly home in Boumalne, Dades valley.

UMBILICAL GATES

Guided by Janneke Raaphorst, The Gifted Mothers of dar Bellarj journeyed to their childhood through their umbilical gate. They formulated an intention to sort out the feelings from their childhood they want to leave behind and the ones they want to invite into their present lives. They expressed their intentions while drawing their umbilical gates with henna on shawls they brought from home, in this way charging them as power objects.
